

Articles of Organization of the Center for Intelligent Agriculture Education and Research College of Bioresources and Agriculture, NTU

Passed at the 2nd University Affairs Meeting in 2010/11 1st semester on January 8, 2011.

Passed at the 3043th Administrative Meeting of the University on June 11, 2019.

Passed at the 1st University Affairs Meeting in 2019/20 1st semester on October 19, 2019.

Article 1

These regulations are prescribed pursuant to Paragraph 1 of Article 29 of National Taiwan University Organizational Charter.

Article 2 Objective

To support the education, research, and service concerning intelligent agriculture in the College of Bioresources and Agriculture (hereafter referred to as the “College”), respond to the interdisciplinary development of the intelligentization of agriculture, and intelligentize future agriculture from the stage of cultivation, the Center for Intelligent Agriculture Education and Research (hereafter referred to as the “Center”) aims to promote intelligent agriculture through integrating the professional technology under different subfields within bio-industry and intelligent agriculture, and planning and developing interdisciplinary courses related to intelligent agriculture in National Taiwan University.

Article 3

The duties of the Center are:

1. Planning and conducting matters concerning the teaching and curriculum, equipment, and funds of intelligent agriculture.
2. Integrating and planning the use of servers and equipment, and providing management and service.
3. Integrating researches and promoting cooperative education in intelligent agriculture within the College.
4. Holding academic speeches, seminars, and training courses.
5. Cultivating talents and providing education related to intelligent agriculture.
6. Conducting matters concerning the research and service of intelligent agriculture.

Article 4

The Advisory Committee of the Center is constituted by full-time faculty recommended by their departments in the College. Each committee member represents one department. The Dean of College is the member and the Coordinator of the Committee by default. The members serve a term of 3 years. They are reported to the president for approval by the Dean of College before appointment.

Article 5

The Center Director is recommended by the Dean of College from the Advisory Committee and reported to the president for approval before appointment. The Director serves a term of 3 years and may be recommended for a second term. He or she is allowed to reduce the teaching hours as regulated to complete the work concerning the Center by the order of the Dean of College.

Article 6

The Teaching Section and the Research Section of the Center are established for different functions, each led by a leader, who is recommended by the Director from the associative professors or above in the College. The leaders are reported to the president for approval by the Dean of College before appointment. The assistant director handles general affairs and coordinates administrative affairs. He or she is allowed to reduce the teaching hours as regulated.

Article 7

To support other teaching and research projects, the Center may employ several instructors and researchers. Existing faculty will be assigned to these positions and appointed as regulated after receiving the approval from the Advisory Committee.

Article 8

Teaching assistants and technicians are recruited from the College or related departments and institutes, responsible for technical, service, and administrative affairs in the Center. Technicians include technicians, senior technicians, technical specialist etc. They are appointed according to their qualifications.

Article 9

The expenses of the Center are covered by the funds provided by organizations related to the government or the College.

Article 10

The Advisory Committee Meeting should take place at least once every semester to evaluate work plans, review the execution of affairs, and report to the College Affairs Meeting.

Article 11

These regulations should come into force from the day of promulgation after being passed at the College Affairs Meeting and the Administrative Meeting of the University and filed for future reference at the University Affairs Meeting.
